PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

What is Lifesharing?

Lifesharing is an enriching program where you can build a meaningful connection with an individual in your community. As part of the program, you invite an individual receiving services for intellectual disability/autism (ID/A) support to live in your home as a member of your family.

Together, you will have many opportunities to connect by planning and cooking meals, enjoying hobbies, and spending time both at home and in the community. You can enrich each other's lives by setting and achieving goals together and supporting personal growth. You may also enjoy sharing family conversations about daily life, dreams, aspirations, and accomplishments.

The individual may need your assistance with transportation to medical appointments, work or day program (if applicable), and other activities. They may also need support with tasks around the home, such as managing personal spaces or helping with household chores. In some cases, they may be fully independent in these areas and primarily benefit from friendship and companionship.

What are the requirements?

Anyone, at any age or stage of life, can become a Lifesharing provider. Requirements include meeting standard employment criteria, such as having a high school diploma or equivalent, passing background checks and a physical, and maintaining

a valid driver's license with a clean driving record.

In addition, your home must have an extra bedroom dedicated to the individual. You must also have the support and flexibility in your schedule to assist with medical appointments and desired activities. Providers are expected to maintain light documentation, including financial, outcome, and attendance records.

Most importantly, you must have the heart and willingness to open your home and life to someone as part of a long-term commitment.

What are the benefits?

Lifesharing allows you to share your home and life with an individual who benefits from your support and companionship. The support you provide helps them grow, achieve goals, and experience greater independence.

In return, you gain meaningful companionship and the opportunity to make a lasting impact in someone's life.

Providers are contracted with Dayspring Homes as independent contractors and receive a biweekly stipend to help cover the individual's living expenses and recognize the time and commitment involved.

We are excited to spotlight Shane Rowles, an Alvernia University graduate who completed two internships with Dayspring Homes. In May, Shane received his Bachelor of Science in Psychology, with a minor in Theatre and Communications and a concentration in music. With a strong academic record, a passion for service, and a natural ability to connect with others, Shane brought both heart and thoughtfulness to his work.

During his time as an intern, Shane supported both residential and day program environments, where he quickly became known for his calm presence, curiosity, and genuine interest in the people we support. One of the most rewarding aspects of his experience was the opportunity to get to know residents and Crosswalk participants as individuals, engaging in activities and learning how best to support them.

Shane shared that his internship provided valuable real world experience that directly complemented his coursework, allowing him to see how classroom learning concepts translate into real world practice. He also noted that the structured onboarding and training process helped set clear expectations and prepared him well for success. 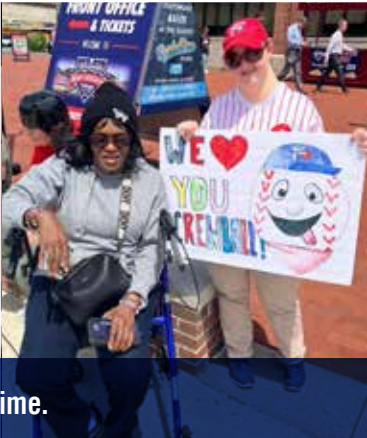
